# **Notes For SLCC Zoom Meeting 4-8-2025**

In Attendance, Kevin, Scott, Ron, Bob, Scott, Richard, and Don

- Quick recap
- The meeting covered a wide range of topics, including personal updates, technology projects, and property-related issues. Participants discussed recent experiences with job interviews, custom-built machines, home security concerns, and beekeeping, as well as property taxes and solar panel systems. The group also shared updates on various hobbies and interests, including model trains, vintage computers, and gaming events.

- Summary
- Richard's Custom Archival Machine
- Richard shares updates on his recent activities. He mentions having a third interview for a job with a Hong Kong-based company. He also showcases a custom-built archival machine he created, which includes a full Windows computer, multiple floppy drive formats, and two Greaseweazle devices for creating and reading floppy disks. Additionally, Richard demonstrates a new device called USB4VC, which allows the use of modern USB and Bluetooth peripherals with legacy computers. He explains that it can be adapted for different vintage systems, including Macs, by changing a board.
- Swatting Incident and Al Surveillance
- Richard discussed his recent experience with a swatting incident involving his daughter. He mentioned that the situation has been escalated and they are now working with the FBI. Richard also shared that the local police chief and some city council members are aware of the situation. He learned about the city's issues from a police officer and also discovered that 3/4 of the police on the street respond to calls. Richard also mentioned that he has been advised to install more cameras at his home. The team discussed the potential for being watched and the implications of AI recording.
- Organizing Storage Room and Drilling Techniques
- Richard discussed his ongoing process of organizing his storage room, specifically focusing on categorizing his various items. Ronald shared his plans to work on a video MOD on his 600 Excel, adding circuitry and a monitor jack. He also mentioned his concerns about

drilling a hole in the old plastic of his Atari 800 XL. Bob provided advice on using a step drill at low speed for drilling holes in old materials. The team also discussed the importance of proper hole drilling techniques and the potential use of a step drill.

## Beekeeping's Financial and Tax Benefits

• Scott discusses his recent experience with beekeeping, including getting stung multiple times and suffering from a swollen arm. He explains the potential financial benefits of beekeeping, citing an example where having 12 hives on 20 acres could save approximately \$6,000 in annual property taxes through an agricultural exemption. Scott mentions that his property's appraised value has increased significantly, and he needs to address this issue with the appraisal district.

### Property Tax Issues in States

• The team discussed property tax issues in their respective states. Bob mentioned that he has one new property, while Richard and Scott discussed the Texas property tax system, which allows for a 10% annual increase. Scott also mentioned the possibility of protesting his property tax increase. Don shared that there is a movement in Florida to eliminate property taxes on primary residences. The team also discussed the homestead exemption in Florida, which reduces the taxable value of a primary residence.

### Home Improvements and Property Tax

• Scott discusses his recent home improvements and property tax assessments. He mentions building a garden shed that is taxed, but notes discrepancies in the square footage and classification that work in his favor. Scott also shares that he bought his wife a 60-inch riding lawn mower for their Texas anniversary, which would be illegal in California due to new regulations banning small off-road engines of 25 horsepower or less. The conversation then shifts to California's electric mandate and its impact on various equipment, including generators in motor homes.

## Solar Panel System Fails Expectations

• Bob discusses his experience with a solar panel system he purchased, which failed to meet his expectations of running lights at night and recharging during the day. Scott mentions that Atari systems require low power, while Kevin recalls that Fry's Electronics used to offer a range of compatible solar components for custom system design. The group discusses the challenges of finding suitable solar equipment, including issues with specifications, interchangeability, and customer support from manufacturers.

# Atari Booth at Midwest Gaming Classic

• In the meeting, Kevin shared a video about the new Atari booth at the Midwest Gaming Classic. The booth featured new games, hardware, accessories, and merchandise.
